Jesus told us to go and make disciples of all the 'nations' in the Great Commission in



Matthew 28:19-20. But today 40% of all the people groups or nations in the world still

remain unreached. (An unreached or least-reached people is a people group among which there is no indigenous community of believing Christians with adequate numbers and resources to evangelize this people group without outside assistance. Or one that is less than 2% Evangelical.) These unreached people are the priority of World Mission!

We also know where these people live. It is a geographic area in the Eastern Hemisphere commonly known as the 10/40 Window that holds 2/3 of the world's population! The 10/40

Window is the rectangular area of North Africa, the Middle East and Asia approximately between 10 degrees north and 40 degrees north latitude. The 10/40 Window is often called "The Resistant Belt" and includes the majority of the world's Muslims, Hindus, and Buddhists. Not only do 8 out of 10 of the world's poorest of the poor live here but more importantly 90% of its occupants are considered unreached.

If you went to a map and drew a line from Senegal in West Africa to the Philippines in Asia, it would represent the region of the world we send Treasures.

Jesus said to go and make disciples of all nations. That Greek word in Matthew 28:19 is actually 'ethnos' which is a reference to people groups. This is a group of people bound together by the same culture, manners, customs and other distinguishing features. This is enormously important in missions because we need to go beyond the mentality of countries (only 195) and begin thinking nations (16,500). Particularly those nations that do not have a gospel witness!

World Mission prioritizes these nations that are referred to as unreached people groups. Amazingly 6,685 of all nations are considered unreached yet they receive less than 1% of all the funding that is given to missions.

Resources are only part of the equation to reach those who have never heard of Jesus. We must first mobilize prayer strategies and commitments. How presumptuous of us as Christians to rush into a nation that has been under darkness for generations without first asking the Lord of the Harvest to lead, guide, protect, provide and prepare?! That becomes the leading edge of the ministry footprint at World Mission.

Matthew 9: 37-38 Then He said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into His harvest."
